## **Burial of a Priest or Bishop during Bright Week**

- 1. Usual Paschal beginning with the Triple-bar candle, cross and censer.
- 2. Blessed is our God... Christ is Risen 3X by the clergy and 3 X by the choir.
- 3. Clergy... Let God Arise... Choir... Christ is Risen, etc.
- 4. Clergy... Christ is Risen from the dead, trampling down death by death.
- 5. Choir... And upon those in the tombs bestowing life.
- 6. Deacon: Great Litany for the Departed. (This is not sung in the melody for the departed but only straight)
- 7. Priest: O God of Spirits... (taken quietly) and the exclamation "For thou art the Resurrection...)
- 8. Then is sung the antiphons, epistles, and gospels (Pages 25-78 from the Funeral of a priest which I have attached also) [from the OCA website]
- 9. PASCHAL CANON... This is the Day of Resurrection... (the full canon is sung and not only the irmosi)
- 10. After the 3<sup>rd</sup> ode, SMALL LITANY FOR THE DEPARTED (*litanies are always sung-straight and never in the funeral melody*) and EXCLAMATION.
- 11. IPAKOI Before the dawn
- 12. Canon continues... After the 6<sup>th</sup> ode, again, Litany for the departed.
- 13. KONTAKION "With the Saints" and also the Ikos.
- 14. CHOIR: "As Many as have been baptized... (as at Liturgy)
- 15. Prokimenon and Epistle "of the Day"
- 16. Gospel (1<sup>st</sup> Resurrection Gospel as taken at Matins)
- 17. Prayer of Absolution
- 18. Choir "Having beheld the Resurrection of Christ" (1X) and "Jesus, having risen from the dead" (1X)
- 19. Canon continues... After the 9<sup>th</sup> ode, again, Litany for the Departed.
- 20. Exapostilarion "In the Flesh..." (3X)
- 21. "Blessed art Thou, O Lord" as taken at Matins and NOT at a Panikhida.
- 22. "Let God arise..." (This is in place of the last kiss.)
- 23. Triple Litany... "Have mercy on us..."
- 24. Wisdom! and ending like at the end of Matins on Pascha.
- 25. Memory Eternal... (Memory eternal may be sung or if the priest wishes, Christ is Risen may be sung.
